



EMS agencies should use this Pediatric Emergency Care Coordinator (PECC) role description to identify and develop the most appropriate individual(s) for the role.

PECC MODELS

The following are acceptable models for EMS agencies wanting to implement the PECC role:



PECC QUALIFICATIONS

The main requirement for someone serving in the PECC role is simply having some passion around improving pediatric emergency care. While having some "expertise" in pediatric care is always great, it is not a requirement for this role. The COPECC program recommends the following qualifications for PECCs:

- 1. May be any level EMS provider, RN, or PA/NP/DO/MD
- 2. Has a specific interest in enhancing delivery of pediatric emergency care
- 3. Maintains competency in pediatric emergency care (e.g., PALS, PEPP, PEARS, etc.)
- 4. Is committed to spending time on PECC responsibilities

Role Description

PEDIATRIC EMERGENCY CARE COORDINATOR RESPONSIBILITIES

The activities taken on by a prehospital PECC are ultimately up to the individual(s) in that role. However, for those wanting more guidance, the COPECC program recommends that, at a minimum, prehospital PECCs assume the responsibilities listed below.

MINIMUM PECC RESPONSIBILITIES

Responsibility	Optional Resources
Ensure agency profile, including the PECC field and PECC contact info, is included and up to date in the state Emergency Medical and Trauma Services branch (EMTS) database	Instructions and access to EMTS organizational <u>profiles</u>
Promote pediatric-specific continuing education at your agency	 EMSC <u>calendar</u> and <u>library</u> <u>Rocky Mountain Hospital for Children</u> and <u>Children's Hospital/EMSC</u> Mobile Sim Labs
Ensure the availability of pediatric-specific equipment and supplies, using the national consensus recommendations and the state minimum equipment list for guidance	 National consensus guidelines on <u>recommended equipment</u> for ambulances State <u>minimum equipment list</u>
Educate fellow EMS providers on family- centered care	NAEMT and EMSC's <u>tips</u> for family-centered prehospital care
Conduct or assist with pediatric quality or process improvement initiatives	National EMS Quality Alliance pediatric performance measures: <u>weigh in kilograms</u> , administration of <u>beta agonist for pediatric</u> <u>asthma</u> , and <u>pediatric respiratory assessment</u>

PEDIATRIC EMERGENCY CARE COORDINATOR RESPONSIBILITIES

Below are additional responsibilities that PECCs can take on to improve their agency's pediatric readiness. PECCs who are already assuming the responsibilities in the table above may consider expanding their role to include some or all of the responsibilities listed below.

ADDITIONAL PECC RESPONSIBILITIES

Responsibility	Resources / Examples
Work with medical director and/or operations leader to ensure pediatric perspective is included in patient care guidelines and protocols	National Association of State EMS Officials (NASEMSO) <u>National Model EMS Clinical</u> <u>Guidelines</u>
Verify, with assistance from the training division, that EMS providers are competent in using the pediatric-specific equipment and supplies	 Pediatric specific procedure <u>videos</u> Find a <u>PALS or PEARS</u> course Find a <u>PEPP</u> course
Identify additional quality and/or performance measures for quality or process improvement initiatives	QI/PI resources in the EIIC's <u>prehospital</u> pediatric readiness toolkit
Periodically review pediatric call data to identify most common calls and inform training needs	For assistance pulling pediatric data, submit an <u>EMTS data request</u>
Promote agency participation in pediatric prevention programs	 CDPHE's <u>injury prevention resources</u> NAEMT's <u>illness and injury prevention</u> <u>resources</u> Child Safety Network <u>resources</u>
